Update on the Canadian Federal Budget Proposal

Impact on Preferred Shares

On November 21, 2023, the Canadian federal government announced that they will be grand fathering the special tax treatment that preferred shares receive for financial institutions that hold them as part of their investment portfolio. This is a complete reversal from their original budget proposal in early 2023 where they had announced that these insurance companies and banks would lose the preferential tax treatment.

This is great news for the preferred shares market as the changes in the proposed budget were weighing heavily on the asset class, with insurance companies holding close to 15% of outstanding preferred shares in Canada. For those insurance companies, it is now clear that they will no longer be looking to sell the asset class, and they may even look to adding instead given the relative attractiveness of preferred shares on a go-forward basis.

Fiera Capital, sub-advisor to Horizons ETFs' HPR and HBYR, believes this news will be very supportive for the preferred shares market.

What does this mean for HPR/HYBR?

- The sub-advisor largely overweighs the preferred shares with reset spreads of 300 bps and lower, and those are the ones that trade at the deepest discounts. The sub-advisor believes that this segment of the market will benefit the most in this new environment.
- Additionally, the sub-advisor has a very large overweight position in fixed-reset preferred shares that are resetting their coupon in 2025, and think those have the largest upside as investors start looking beyond 2024 and into these preferred shares that had their last coupon set in 2020 when rates were near historical lows.
- All in all, the sub-advisor believes their positioning in both HPR and HYBR will be very favorable for investors in the next 12 to 18 months.

Dividend Received Deduction by Financial Institutions – Exception

The Income Tax Act permits corporations to claim a deduction in respect of dividends received on shares of other corporations resident in Canada. Budget 2023 proposed to deny the dividend received deduction in respect of dividends received by financial institutions on shares that are mark-tomarket property. The 2023 Fall Economic Statement proposes an exception to this measure for dividends received on "taxable preferred shares" (as defined in the Income Tax Act). This exception, along with the rest of the measure, would apply to dividends received on or after January 1, 2024.

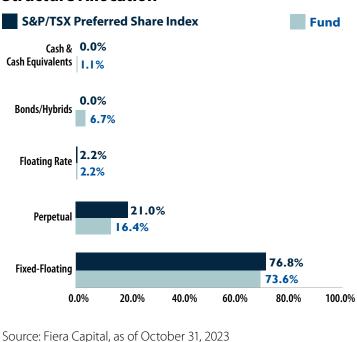

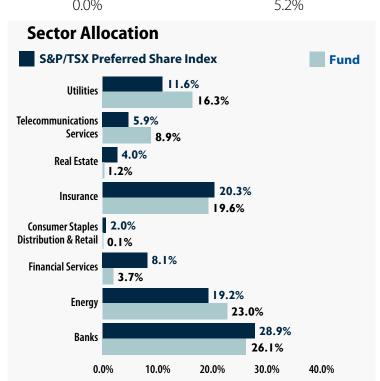

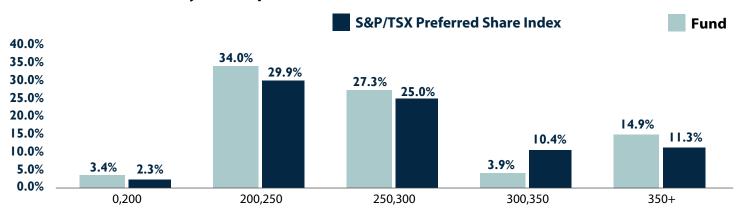

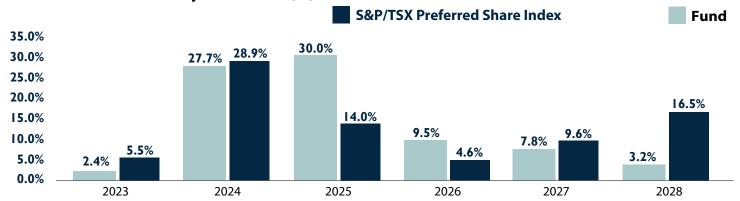

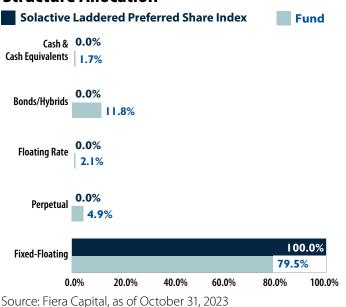

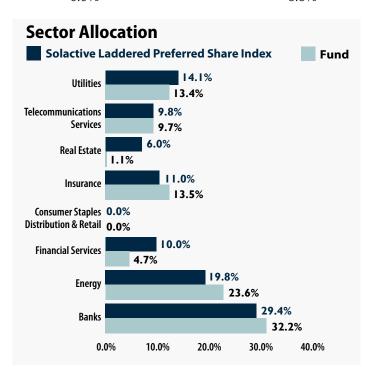

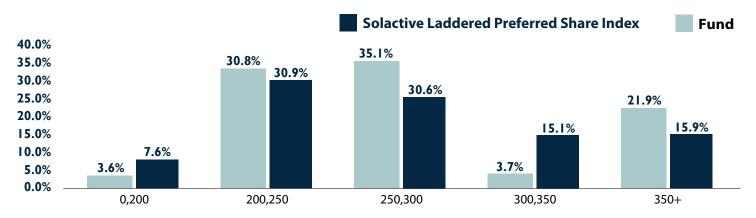

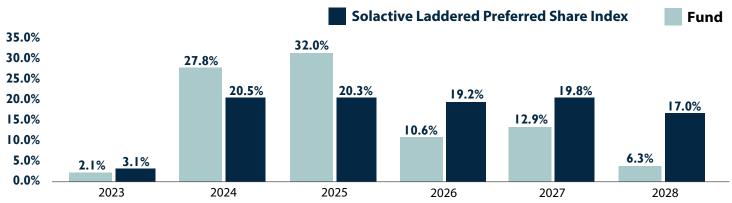
